Course and Exam Regulations HfWU

Nürtingen-Geislingen University Addendum for the Master's Program in International Management

Date: 20 April 2023

Legal basis

Based on section 8 (6) in conjunction with section 30 (1) and section 32 (3) of the state higher education act in Baden-Württemberg ("Landeshochschulgesetz" - LHG) dated 01 January 2005 (law gazette 2005, page 1), last amended by article 8 of the act dated 07 February 2023 (law gazette pages 26 and 43), the senate of Hochschule für Wirtschaft und Umwelt Nürtingen-Geislingen (Nürtingen-Geislingen University) agreed the following course and exam regulations for the Master's Program in International Management on 06 April 2023.

1) Individual regulations

1.1 Structure of the program

The Master's Program in International Management comprises 3 study semesters. Admission requirements are governed by the statutes of admission.

- (1) The modules and module examinations required for successful completion of the master's program are listed in the table in part 2. In principle, classes and examinations will be held in English.
- (2) The total amount of elective and compulsory modules required for successful completion of the program is defined in credits. 90 credits are required for the master's program.
- (3) The master's program consists of compulsory modules and one elective module plus, if applicable, additional modules. The compulsory modules and the range of electives are outlined in part 2. In exceptional cases, students can apply to the Examination Board for approval to take suitable modules from other master's programs at Nürtingen-Geislingen University. As far as the additional modules are concerned, the students in the master's program may choose from all modules available at Nürtingen-Geislingen University.
- (4) Each student must choose an elective module. The deadlines for registration will be notified in advance.
- (5) By derogation from sect. 2 (9) of the course and exam regulations of Nürtingen-Geislingen University (general provisions for bachelor's and master's programs), some parts of the class and/or of the examinations in a course or a module may be offered online, e.g. via video calls. Therefore, students must ensure they have the necessary prerequisites available for taking part in online classes, especially an internet-ready device with a camera and a microphone and access to the internet.

1.2 Module examinations

- (1) In principle, module examinations must be taken as listed in the table in part 2.
- (2) The topics for the "Preparatory Seminar Master's Thesis" for the following semester will be posted 4 weeks before the end of the current lecture period. Registration takes place one week after the topics have been posted. The written assignment must be handed in no later than one week after the beginning of the lecture period.
- (3) If a module examination involves giving a presentation, the topics will be announced by the lecturer in charge during the first two weeks of the semester.
- (4) Only students who have already provided proof of their German language skills at level A2 or better can be admitted for the master's thesis.
